The Tension: Have you noticed there is often times a gap between who you are and who you want to be? Or what you want to be doing compared to what you are doing?

For example: Having a healthy body with eating habits or exercise, letting go of anger, having margin financially, simplifying your schedule, being more content etc...

The Problem: If we could change it on our own we would. John Maxwell said, "Most people have uphill dreams and downhill habits."

The Solution: You need something bigger, more powerful than yourself. This is where the Easter story meets your need.

Main Idea: Easter is proof that God provides the power you need to be the person you really want to be!
