BIBLE READING PLANS

Take your daily quiet time habit and add community to it this summer. Commit to bible reading plan together as a group- and then gather weekly to run through our discussion guide for key takeaways (observation and application) and accountability to put into practice what scripture reveals. Pick a plan based on your availability- week by week or 30-45 days. Want to dive in the for the whole year? We recommend **The Bible Recap** on YouVersion or online.

A few shorter plans for your consideration:

- **The Gospels in 30** - All Gospels in 30 days (2-4 chapters a day)
- **The Life of Jesus in 45 days** - two chapters a day
- **The Bible Story in 40 Days** - Arc of the Scriptures in select daily readings

SERMON DISCUSSIONS

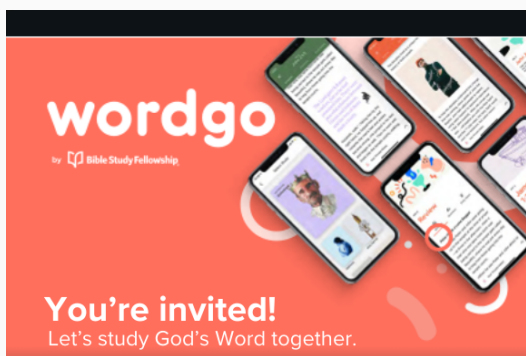
Take notes on Sunday mornings and gather with a crew weekly to discuss the Sunday sermon. Review the scripture covered and study it together, discussing personal application and take-aways. Grab some friends for a regular discussion of the Sunday morning sermons to go further together by deepening your understanding of the text and principles and putting into practice what the Word and Spirit have revealed.

Quick-fire questions for sermon discussion:

1. What did the scriptures from the message reveal about God?
2. About humanity?
3. And about me personally?
4. What's one step of obedience I can take today/tomorrow in response to the message?
5. Was there anything from this message I should share with someone else in order to encourage them?

WORDGO BIBLE STUDY

Use the **WordGo app** Bible Study with friends. **WordGo** is a free app that helps you build a daily rhythm of Bible study. Here's how it works: the app walks you through daily scripture reading with questions for understanding and application. You can dig deeper with an audio teaching and study notes on your own, and then gather together to discuss, pray, and grow together. This is a fully contained study that you can use individually but is even better with a group. The perfect option for groups on the go as there are no workbooks, handouts, or materials- it's all on the app!



Once you've created an account, you can browse the course library to read about available studies and preview content. There are 2, 3, 4, and 5 week study options that cover books of the bible, character studies, or follow themes throughout scripture.
